

**ORDINANCE #444**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING  
THE WILBUR MUNICIPAL CODE  
TITLE 13, CHAPTER 13.20**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WILBUR, WASHINGTON AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 13.20 of the Wilbur Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

13.20.080 Ambulance Fund. Fees for the ambulance fund shall be as follows:

- A. Single Patient.
  1. Resident (inside city limits), one hundred sixty dollars.
  2. Nonresident, one hundred sixty dollars.
  3. Ambulance call out fee-nontransport, one hundred sixty dollars.
- B. Mileage per mile, one-way: seven dollars and fifty cents.
- C. Multiple: Person in life threatening situation receives full charge. Additional patients are rated as follows:
  1. Per patient, thirty-five dollars.
  2. Mileage per mile, one-way, per patient, one dollar.
- D. Waiting time, per hour; one hundred dollars.
- E. Other Services.
  1. Oxygen, fifteen dollars.

2. Resuscitator Bag w/Oral Airway, twenty dollars.
3. Suction, seven dollars.
4. Combi Tube Airway, fifty five dollars.
5. Oral Airway, four dollars.
6. MAST trouser use, thirty dollars.
7. OB kit, twenty dollars.
8. Burn sheet, fifteen dollars.
9. Hot/cold pack, four dollars.
10. Trauma dressing, five dollars.
11. Ace bandage, four dollars.
12. Disposable or Vacuum splint, ten dollars.
13. Cervical collar, twenty dollars.
14. Bandages, five dollars.
15. IV therapy, thirty dollars.
16. Saline Lock, ten dollars.
17. Disposable Blanket, seven dollars and fifty cents.
18. Glucose Test kit, seven dollars and fifty cents.
19. Oral Glucose, five dollars.
20. Charcoal - Poison Kit, fifteen dollars.
21. Eppie Pen, sixty dollars.
22. Wound Kit, four dollars.
23. Defibrillator,  
     w/Shock Pads, fifty dollars.  
     w/Monitor Pads, ten dollars.

13.20.110 Tax on utility accounts.

A. The utility accounts in the town both residential and commercial will be charged a flat monthly rate of six dollars and fifty cents per account.

B. The funds collected from this account shall be placed as follows: four dollars will be placed into the current expense fund and the additional two dollars and fifty cents shall be used to finance the street fund.

13.20.120 Charge for loan repayment.

A. From and after January 1, 1997, until all loans on the sewer system are paid in full and a subsequent ordinance is passed by the council changing the sewer rates, all customers shall pay an additional nine dollars and sixty cents per account per month in addition to the basic fee. This additional charge is caused by the current sewer system improvements. Beginning January 1, 2004, council is reducing the sewer rate fee by three dollars and sixty cents per account per month. This reduction brings the sewer loan rate fee to six dollars per account per month.

B. From and after January 1, 1999, until all loans on the water system are paid in full and a subsequent ordinance is passed by the council changing the water rates, all customers shall pay an additional eleven dollars per account per month in addition to the basic fee. This additional charge is caused by

the costs of an upgrade to the water system which has been constructed.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This amendment shall be effective after passage and publication.

SECTION 4. The attached ordinance summary is hereby approved and the Town Clerk is directed to publish the same in the Town's official newspaper pursuant to RCW 35.27.300.
