

**PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY
CITY OF BOTHELL**

WHEREAS, the Emergency Services Director has reported to the Mayor of the City of Bothell, that beginning on the 3rd day of December 2007, flooding may cause residential, business, roadway and bridge flooding closures with potential evacuations of areas due to excess flood waters causing ingress and egress issues in the City of Bothell, and;

Because of flooding these problems have created a threat to life and property, and all available resources are being committed to disaster work, and the city requires supplemental assistance, and

THEREFORE, this event constitutes an emergency as defined by the City of Bothell Emergency Operations Plan and necessitates the utilization of emergency powers granted under RCW 38.52.070;

THEREFORE, IT IS PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF BOTHELL:

A local emergency exists within the City of Bothell due to flooding and emergency powers as defined under RCW 38.52.070 are enacted.

City of Bothell Mayor Proclaims Local Emergency; Other Updates Included

Bothell, Wash. – [City of Bothell Mayor Mark Lamb has proclaimed a local emergency in Bothell city limits.](#) . Mayor Lamb provides the following statement:

“The City of Bothell is taking all necessary measures to ensure life safety for our citizens,” said Mayor Mark Lamb. “The City is in full response to this emergency and is continuing to monitor the conditions as they are changing rapidly. Please secure yourself and your family, and ensure your emergency response plan is in place.”

A local emergency exists within the City of Bothell due to flooding and emergency powers as defined under RCW 38.52.070 are enacted.

Other updates include:

- Mandatory evacuations are in effect:
 - North Creek Business Park
 - Quinton Industries (business)
 - Northshore School District Administration Building
- Northshore Senior Center (10201 E. Riverside Drive, Bothell; 425.487.2441) is offering its center for citizens who need a temporary dry indoor location through 4:30 p.m. today
- Bothell Regional Library (18215 98th Avenue NE, Bothell) is offering its center for citizens who need a temporary dry indoor location through 9 p.m. today
- All City of Bothell Parks and Recreation events, programs and classes are cancelled today

- Volunteers are needed; contact City of Bothell Emergency Operations Center at 425.487.5000
- The following closures remain in effect:
 - 19th Avenue SE between 235th Street SE and 242nd Street SE
 - 120th Avenue NE between NE 195th Street to North Creek Parkway North
 - 228th Street between 19th Avenue SE to Fitzgerald Road
 - 240th Street SE between 35th Avenue SE and Fitzgerald Road

- 35th Avenue SE between 236th and 240th Streets SE
- Blyth Park (16950 W. Riverside Drive)
- Intersections at:
 - NE 195th Street and North Creek Parkway
 - Hollyhills Drive and 129th Avenue.
