





**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUPEVILLE SCHOOL DISTRICT
AND TOWN OF COUPEVILLE**
For GJJAC Grant 2000-2001

THIS AGREEMENT IS MADE with reference to the following facts:

- A. The Town of Coupeville was awarded a grant for \$77,692 from the Governor's Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee (GJJAC) for the 2000-2001 program year.
- B. Execution of this Agreement shall comprise the authority to enter into a subcontracting relationship to further the purposes of the GJJAC Program.
- C. It is the recommendation of both the Town and the Contractor that this Agreement be executed subject to the terms and conditions set forth below.

IT IS THEREFORE AGREED as follows:

1. DUTIES OF THE TOWN.

The Town shall remit to the Contractor, in a timely fashion (not to exceed 30 days), a warrant in response to appropriate monthly or quarterly billing by the Contractor. In no event will the total paid be more than the budgeted amount of \$56,866.

2. DUTIES OF THE CONTRACTOR.

2.1 The Contractor shall provide those services outlined in the application for 2000-2001 GJJAC Program funding, the provisions of which are incorporated herein.

2.2 The Contractor shall submit to the Town a monthly or quarterly billing based on services rendered to date. The billing shall be detailed as to expenditure category, and all in-kind match shall be noted along with the reimbursement request.

3. TERM.

The term of this contract shall be from April 1, 2000 and will end March 31, 2001.

4. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.

The Contractor shall be considered an independent contractor and this Agreement shall not be construed as creating any form of partnership between the Town and the Contractor.

5. NO ASSIGNMENT.

The Contractor shall not assign this Agreement or subcontract its duties to another party without the expressed prior written consent of the Town.

6. ACCOUNTABILITY.

6.1 Provisions of Contract # I-200-00100 between the State of Washington Department of Social & Health Services, Office of Juvenile Justice and the Town of Coupeville shall be adhered to by the Contractor, and are hereby adopted by reference.

6.2 A quarterly single page progress report shall be submitted to the Town with requests for reimbursement. A final report shall be submitted with the final funding request.

7. MISCELLANEOUS.

7.1 This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Washington.

7.2 This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and no addition, deletion or other amendment to this Agreement may be made except as is agreed in writing by the two parties in advance, with the same formality accorded this Agreement.

This project continues a successful Student Assistance Program now operating in grades 4-12 in the Coupeville School District. Through the Student Assistance Program, students are connected with appropriate support services available in the schools and community. Services include individual or group counseling, provision of school supplies, connections with mentors or tutors, obtaining eyeglasses, and referrals for assessment or treatment. The collaborative nature of the program has been key to its success. With grant support, we now have trained 46 school staff, 3 town police officers, and 48 students in the SAP model!

The project also supports community-based programs for youth, including After-the-Facts on Friday afternoons and Late Nite Central on Saturday nights. These programs offer safe, supervised, and constructive alternatives for students with no place to go or who seek positive social interactions. The after school program, in particular, has been very successful in engaging youth who otherwise would not be involved in school activities.
