

RESOLUTION #262  
A RESOLUTION SETTING PRICES FOR  
CLEAN UP DAYS SET BY THE TOWN  
OF WILBUR FOR 2003

WHEREAS the Town of Wilbur has voted to assist the citizens with the clean up of the residential area, and

WHEREAS this service is available for the same rates to all citizens of the Town of Wilbur,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Wilbur as follows:

1. Two days with no fee are set for Town of Wilbur residents to haul branches and yard waste to the brush pit. They are Saturdays, April 26<sup>th</sup> and May 3<sup>rd</sup> from 10 am to 3 pm.

2. Two days midweek for the collection of brush and yard waste are set for May 6<sup>th</sup> and May 7<sup>th</sup>. Town employees will pick up, for the following rates: first pickup load free, second load or larger than a pickup load, \$7.50. Yard waste must be at the curbside for pick up and will be collected from 8 am to 2 pm only each day.

3. One day midweek for the collection of white goods and appliances is set for May 8<sup>th</sup> where Town employees will pick up, at the following cost: hot water heaters, stoves, large microwaves, dishwashers, washing machines, dryers, etc. at a cost of \$10.00 each. Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, (anything that has or has ever had freon in it) at a cost of \$15.00 per item. A transportation fee of \$2 per item will be charged. Should one residence have a large amount of clean up, a single \$10.00 transportation fee plus the items will be charged. All items to be removed must be at the curbside for pick up and will be collected between 8 am to 2 pm only.

4. All citizens desiring curbside service on May 6<sup>th</sup>, May 7<sup>th</sup> or May 8<sup>th</sup> must call Town Hall by May 1<sup>st</sup> to have their names put on a list for pick up.

5. The above schedule is the only times and dates set aside for such cleanup as provided by the Town.

6. Payment must be made in advance.
