Herculean effort. There are 389 files waiting for terminations to get done. It takes about 20 minutes of staff time per file. Mr. Lowe explained some of the physical work that has to be performed on the files. There have been about 500 cases a year for the last eight years. We expect there are many more terminations sitting out there. We have had people work overtime but we can't get caught up. We are on top of all current show causes and violations and warrants but termination of supervision cases are sitting in his office waiting for time to work on them. Mr. Lowe will be asking shortly for overtime funding to get these caught up.
